Motion by Brittany Hoversland, second by Mike Loutzenhiser to approve the Consent Agenda Minutes of February 15, 2023 and Claims for February 2023 as listed. Motion Carried. All Aye.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Clerk Dukart reported that Karol Zachmann, representing the Leaping Leprechaun Pub Crawl requested to amend the Facilities Use Agreement to include lift Open Container Ordinance on 2<sup>nd</sup> ST W from Montana to Railroad Avenues for the event. Motion by Mike Loutzenhiser, second by Brittany Hoversland to approve the amendment. Motion Carried. All Aye.







# Street Sweeping Agreement

This agreement is between the City of Baker and the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) for defining street sweeping and flushing responsibilities of the City and MDT in accordance with state law which allows MDT to enter into an agreement with local governments to provide maintenance of State routes with provision for full reimbursement. The term of this agreement shall be for one year beginning July 1, 2023.

LIMITS OF AGREEMENT: The listing of streets and intersections identified under ITEMS COVERED is a full and complete listing of areas covered by this agreement. Unless otherwise defined, that list includes all intersections along the route and intersecting streets for a distance of 15' or to the end of the curb radius return, whichever is greater, and shall include all of the street right of way. During the term of this Agreement, additional areas may be added by written Agreement of the parties.

**SCOPE OF AGREEMENT:** This agreement covers all activities ordinarily associated with street sweeping and flushing activities.

**ITEMS COVERED:** Payment to the City for this Agreement shall be for the following:

# STREET CLEANING ACTIVITIES:

The City will flush, sweep and clean the streets identified below once every week beginning July 1, 2023 and ending the last Friday of the first full week in October (approximately 14 weeks). Activities will resume beginning the 15<sup>th</sup> of April and end on June 30, 2024, approximately 7 weeks, which is the end of the MDT fiscal year.

The City agrees to furnish labor and furnish and maintain all equipment necessary to the successful fulfillment of this agreement.

- A. Montana Highway 7 beginning at Intersection of Prairie Avenue and Montana Highway 7 and proceeding south to the intersection of Montana Highway 7 and Montana Highway 12, and from the intersection of Montana Highway 7 and Montana Highway 12 south to the first entrance to the Fallon County Fairgrounds.
- B. <u>U.S. Highway 12</u> beginning at East 10<sup>th</sup> Street and proceeding west to the west side of the entrance to the Baker Rural/Baker Volunteer Fire Department building located on U.S. Highway 12.

MONTANA PRODUCT PREFERENCE: The City will provide Montana-made goods where those goods are comparable in price and quality to those required by this Agreement pursuant to Section 18-1-112(1), MCA.

**COSTS / PAYMENT:** The costs associated with this Agreement shall be \$8694.00 for the period beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024. This will be a lump sum payment for the activity described and shall be paid to the City at the end of the contract period. Specifics used to develop these costs are as follows:

Mobile Sweeper

\$70.00 per hour

Operator

\$33.50 per hour

Avg. per hour

Cost of operations

\$103.50 per hour

21 total weeks of sweeping @ 4.0 hours per week or 84 total hours.

The City shall submit billing and a narrative summary of the work done in the period of this Agreement on or before June 10, 2024. MDT agrees to make payment within 20 calendar days of receipt of the billing.

In the event that during any session of the state legislature during the term of this Agreement a reduction of funding is directed for operation of MDT the same rate of reduction shall apply to the total of this Agreement plus any special projects Agreement (i.e. if a 5% reduction is experienced, this reduction will be taken from the special projects agreement).

**RECORDS:** The labor, equipment and materials used on the streets covered in this Agreement shall be assigned a special budget category by the City. No record keeping shall be attempted to break contractual costs against individual streets that are covered in this Agreement. All City records concerning this project are open for review and/or audit by representatives of MDT or the Legislative Auditor at any reasonable time.

**TERMINATION:** This Agreement may be terminated upon thirty days written notice, delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, by either party. Upon service of such notice, MDT is liable only for actual work completed as of the date of the notice.

**QUARTERLY MEETING:** There shall, as a minimum, be one meeting per calendar quarter to assess the effectiveness of this program and to ensure that budgeting restraints are met. Either party to this Agreement may have any staff present.

HOLD HARMLESS / INDEMNIFICATION: The City agrees to defend, protect, indemnify and save harmless the State, its elected and appointed officials, and the Department from any and all claims, losses, damage or causes of action arising from or due to, or allegedly arising from or due to the acts, omissions or manner of performance of any of the services or duties under this Agreement to be performed by the City or its contractor, or subcontractor, including any claims by employees or third persons, except that the City is not responsible for any liability arising from the sole negligence of the State.

**CIVIL RIGHTS COMPLIANCE:** The City must comply with all applicable Federal and State laws including, but not limited to, prevailing wage laws and those laws referred to in the two- page NOTICE attached hereto, which is made a part of this Agreement by its reference.

**LAW AND VENUE:** The laws of Montana govern This Agreement. The parties agree that, in the event of any dispute concerning this Agreement, any litigation must be brought in the First Judicial District, in and for Lewis & Clark County.

**ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** This document, with the attached Notice, contains the entire Agreement between the parties, and no statements, promises or inducements made by either party or its agents which in any way modifies, alters or changes the contents of the document is binding. Any subsequent modification must be done by a separate written document.


